NFHS-I: 1992-93

SilfW

- >88,562 households
- >89,777 ever-married women age 13-49 years in
- >24 states and the National Capital Territory of Delhi
- > NFHS-II: 1998-99
 - database for implementation of the Reproductive and Child Health (RCH)
 - >91,000 ever-married women age 15-49 yrs.
 - >all 26 states of India
- > NFHS-III:2005-06
 - >124,385 women age 15-49 and 74,369 men age 15-54
 - >from all 29 states throughout India
 - >102,946 women and men were tested for HIV



Scope of NFHS-3

- Coverage
 - All 29 states covered
 - Slum and non-slum areas of (Chennai, Delhi, Hyderabad, Indore, Kolkata, Meerut, Mumbai, Nagpur)
- Interviewees
 - ➤ Women age 15-49
 - Men age 15-54



Biomarkers Measured in NFHS-3

- Height and weight
- Hemoglobin content in the blood to measure anemia
- Collection of blood samples for HIV testing

Household & Individual Characteristics
Sample for 29 States

Category	Number Interviewed	Response Rate
Households	109,041	97.7
Women (age 15-49)	124,385	94.5
Men (age 15-54)	74,369	87.1


NFHS-3 Finds Some Improvements in the Household Environment Since NFHS-2

- > 68% have electricity, up from 60% in NFHS-2
- > 88% use an improved source of drinking water
- ➤ Only 29% have improved toilet facilities



Total Fertility Rate of Rajasthan






Wanted and Actual Fertility Rates

Age at Marriage




Percentage of women age 20-24 married by age 18






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




Knowledge of Modern Methods






Percent of women and men 15-49 aware of family planning methods





Desire for No More Children among Women with 2 Children






Trends in Antenatal Care







Maternity Care (for most recent birth in the last 5 years)






Infant Mortality Rate








Immunization and Child Health




Percent of children age 12-23 months vaccinated






Trends in Child Nutritional Status

Percent of children age under 3 years















Percent of men age 15-49




HIV Knowledge, Behavior and Prevalence











Most Adults Support Family Life Education in Schools

- > 63% women and 81% men think that
 - information about HIV/AIDS should be taught in schools to both boys and girls
- ➤ More than 40% of women and 60% of men
 - are in favor of teaching about sexual behavior and condom use to avoid sexually transmitted diseases
- Adults are less likely to favor teaching about contraception than about HIV/AIDS



Coverage of HIV Testing

- > % of eligible women age 15-49 and men age 15-54 whose blood was tested for HIV
 - > Women: 85 percent
 - > Men: 78 percent
- Response rates are comparable to HIV
 test on national household surveys
 worldwide



HIV Prevalence

➤ Based on HIV tests of 102,946 blood samples-

(52,853 from de facto women age 15-49 **+** 50,093 from de facto men age 15-54)

 ➤ 60% higher among males than females and 40% higher in urban than rural(by Residence and Sex, India)

Summary and Highlights



- > Improvements seen in child survival
- > Fertility continues to decline
 - ➤ Urban women
 - > reached replacement level fertility
 - >rural women
 - >an average of three children
- First time more than half of currently married women are using a contraceptive method



- Steady decline in the proportion of women age 20-24 marrying before the legal minimum age of marriage
- Improvements in ANC,ID, & assistance at delivery by a health professional, but the changes over time have been slow
- Immunization coverage has improved for all vaccines except DPT



- Full immunization coverage not changed much in the last 7 years
- Under nutrition and anemia among children remain major challenges
- Adults suffer a dual burden of under nutrition and over nutrition
- HIV prevalence of men and women age 15-49 is 0.28 %
